Both winning drivers for the "Rich Vogler Classic were former Quarter Midget drivers. Bobby Santos won the Traxxas Silver Crown race and Tracy Hines won the USAC Mopar Midget event.

Friday Semi Mains were run before a tour of Tony Stewart Racing. Representatives of the AARP Foundation, Jeff Gordon's Drive to End Hunger came out to visit the top 3 drivers who had collected sponsorship for heat races. There were also 2 Red Rookie and a Blue Rookie A Mains along with Mopar Victory Lane Awards and Rookie Class photos.

Saturday morning met with cooler temperatures; just perfect racing weather. AARP Executives returned with information for the top 3 collectors to meet with Jeff Gordon on Sunday at the Brickyard 400. "We were so impressed with the hospitality of your staff, the races and the entire event," said Jim Nedohon of AARP. "We wanted to come back out and let you know that we want to take 6 drivers to meet Jeff."

There were 14 main events run on Saturday, ending with Tech. Brickyard Champions were presented with a commemorative Brick as well as adorned with the traditional wreath. First, Second and Third place winners were presented with Gold, Silver and Bronze USAC Medals. Honda Contingency Awards were also available as well as Simpson Gift Certificates for the winners. Briggs and Stratton gave Amsoil 4T Oil to 2nd & 3rd place finishers in World Formula Classes as well as a Pressure Washer to the winners. Animal Class winners received a new 'Whisper Quiet' Generator, 2nd place a pressure washer and 3rd place winners, Amsoil 4T Oil. All podium finishers also received Hoosier Neck Bands.

USAC would like to thank the entire Mini Indy club for hosting the 2012 National event. The entire complex was wrapped in banners of bricks. It was certainly a "Battle at the Brickyard" to remember!

To end the weekend, USAC .25 drivers, who had pre-registered by July 9, received tickets to the "Brickyard 400" at Indianapolis Motor Speedway. Townsend Wright, Cole Roseman, Collin Miller, Ben Buchard, and Logan and Ryan Huggler, were treated to the hospitality of the AARP Foundation with goodies from the AARP Fan trailer, a VIP ride to the Plaza Area and a Meet and Greet with Jeff Gordon. Gordon took time to have a private meeting with the drivers first to shake their hand and thank them for collecting for AARP. Once in the event, Jeff again thanked the kids and announced that they had collected \$2,047 to be donated to help feed Seniors in the Indianapolis area. As he introduced the .25 drivers to the crowd, he said, "I started running quarter midgets at 5 years old. These kids are the future of racing. I firmly believe that if I hadn't been racing quarter midgets as a kid, I wouldn't be here today." These 6 drivers were also treated to a visit to Tech as well as a private simulator ride in the Sprint Fan Zone.
